

FIRST SUNDAY UNDER WING OF CITY

Annexation of Beach Park, However, Doesn't Dampen Amusement.

Evidences of city rule in Ontario Beach Park were plentiful yesterday, it being the first Sunday that the amusement place was open since the annexation bill and the resulting municipal ordinances went into effect.

Notwithstanding the air of supervision that prevailed, and although the customary outdoor performances were markedly absent, yet there was an abundance of pleasure within reach and of a sort that appeared to find favor with those who sought the park. There were those who preferred to sit on the benches lining the walks and fronting the beach while they restfully absorbed lake breezes and the programmes of Monk's Ontario Beach Band. Others made up little family parties here and there in the picnic grounds, where onslaught was made on the omnipresent hard boiled egg and kindred outing day fare. But, as Landlord Ernest Chase of the Hotel Ontario, found to his satisfaction, and, as was shown by the verandas of the Hotel Ontario, there were many whose equipment on their yesterday's lakeside trip did not include luncheon.

Roller Skating is Popular.

The roller skating feature was the object of much attention, the building in which it is installing being thronged with skaters during the day and evening. Due, probably, to extending the free admission feature of last Saturday, and continuing the "Fleischman contest" pony exhibit, there was another influx of children yesterday. Stalls must have been welcome places last night to "Buster" and "Punch" and the rest of the pony contingent, after the demands made upon them by their visitors, who either rode or drove the little animals around the lawns at will. Hilarity Hall, flying airships, canals of Venice, "The Breezer" and "Through the Trenches" were all in full swing and often during the day were taxed to their fullest capacity.

City Policemen on the Job.

That Ontario Beach Park is to be well and thoroughly policed and that the maintenance of rigid order is in force, as promised by the management, was plainly shown by the presence of Rochester policemen in all parts of the grounds during the day and evening. Especially noticeable was the effect produced by this, their initial appearance in connection with a Sunday amusement proposition.
